Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement

INTRODUCTION

The Modern Slavery Act 2015 (“the Act”) requires organisations to publish an annual slavery and human trafficking statement disclosing what steps are being taken to ensure modern slavery is not taking place in any of its business or supply chains.

Modern slavery encompasses slavery, servitude, human trafficking and forced labour. Metalogic sàrl has a zero tolerance approach to any form of modern slavery. We are committed to acting ethically and with integrity and transparency in all business dealings and to putting effective systems and controls in place to safeguard against any form of modern slavery taking place within the business or our supply chain.

OUR BUSINESS

Metalogic was founded in Luxembourg in 1978, and started as computer consultants and developed important software for Burroughs, including parts of each of: the MCP, programming languages (ALGOL, FORTRAN and APL), and DMSII (DMINTERPRETER).

Since 1981, and the release of the automated operations product, SUPERVISOR, Metalogic has become largely a software producer for the Unisys A-Series machines.

Metalogic is operated from two main offices, in Luxembourg and in Stirling, Scotland. Its clients are worldwide.

OUR POLICIES

We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains or in any part of our business. Our Anti-slavery Policy reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implement and enforce effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chains.

DUE DILIGENCE PROCESSES FOR SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

As part of our initiative to identify and mitigate risk we have in place systems to:

1. Identify and assess potential risk areas when considering taking on new suppliers and regularly review our existing supply chains.
2. Mitigate the risk of slavery and human trafficking occurring in our supply chains.
3. Monitor potential risk areas in our supply chains.
4. Protect whistle blowers.

OUR SUPPLY CHAINS AND SUPPLIER ADHERENCE TO OUR VALUES

The relationship with all our suppliers has been established over a number of years and Metalogic acknowledges responsibility to the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and will ensure transparency within the organisation and with suppliers of goods and services.

To date we have not been made aware of any human trafficking / slavery activities within our supply chain but if any were highlighted to us then we would act immediately in accordance with our legal and moral obligations.

TRAINING

We are looking at ways to increase awareness within our organisation and to ensure a high level of understanding of the risks involved with modern slavery and human trafficking in our supply chains and in our business.

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes our Company's slavery and human trafficking statement for the current financial year.
